INVITATION TO THE LORD'S TABLE

*Today we are observing pew communion. All who find themselves in communion with God or in need of communion with God are invited to share in the bread and cup of the Lord's Table. We observe open communion in the United Church of Christ, which means that **all** are welcome to share in this sacrament. When the bread is served, please take a piece and hold it until all are served. We will eat the bread together. The glasses of wine will then be served. The innermost circle of glasses contains grape juice for those who would prefer it. Please take a glass, hold it until all are served. We will drink together. If you choose not to partake of the elements of bread and wine, you may celebrate communion with God and others through silent prayer and meditation.*

Leader: *Beloved of Christ, the Gospel tells us that on the first day of the week Jesus Christ was raised from the dead, appeared to Mary Magdalene, on that same day with two*

disciples, and was made known to them through the breaking of bread.

People: This celebration of Communion is a joyful feast of the people of God.

Leader: This table is open to all Christians who wish to know the presence of Christ and to share in the community of God's chosen people. (All who are able please stand now.)

Leader: God be with you.

People: And also with you.

Leader: Lift up your hearts.

People: We lift them to God.

Leader: Let us give thanks to God Most High.

People: It is right to give God thanks and praise.

BLESSING OF THE ELEMENTS

Leader: As they gathered in the upper room during Passover, and on the very night of Christ's betrayal, Jesus took bread, and after giving thanks, he broke it, and gave it to the disciples. He said, "Take, eat: This is my body which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me."

In the same way also after supper, Jesus took the cup, and after giving thanks, gave it to them and said; "Drink this, all of you: This is my blood of the new covenant, which is poured out for you and many, for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me."

People: Christ's death we proclaim. Christ's resurrection we declare. Christ's coming we await. Glory be to You, O God.

Leader: *Eternal God, we unite in this covenant of faith, recalling Christ's suffering and death, rejoicing in Christ's resurrection, and awaiting Christ's return in victory.*

We spread Your table with these gifts of the earth and of our labor. We present to you our very lives, committed to Your service and Your witness to the world.

People: Be present with us as we share this meal, and throughout all our lives, that we may know You as the Holy One, who with Christ, and the Holy Spirit, lives forever. Amen.

PROCLAIMING THE LORD'S PRAYER

Leader: *Let us say that which Our Lord and Savior has taught us to pray:*

People: Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name. Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For Thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.
